Materials:

Thread, two to three various colors

Sewing needles

Fabric scissors

Miscellaneous fabric scraps or textile materials from your existing stash; full laundry-basket sized amount of textiles to begin working with. You may not use them all, but it's nice to have options.

Ideas for what to look for:

- Textiles/fabric that are no longer useful or damaged that can be cut up (clothing, sheets, blankets, table cloths, etc.)
- Sentimental textiles that are stored but never used; not necessarily for cutting up, but may be better loved and enjoyed if they are turned into an object or artwork than you can see every day!

Bonus decorative items; examples include trim, fringe, yarn, ribbon, lace, unfinished or failed sewing/knitting/crochet projects, buttons, beads, felt, embroidery thread, etc.
