## **Local Fabric Stores**

SR Harris Fabrics Local small shops – Treadle, Lakes Makerie, Sewing Lounge, etc Hobby Lobby Walmart JoAnn Fabrics

## Online Fabric Stores, a sampling

Spandex House and Spandex World – tons of knits with spandex (aka Lycra), solids and prints, many with glitter, mirror, foils, lace, faux leather, mesh, too many to list

TheFabricFairy.com – excellent resource for knits, printed knits, and swimwear

Wholesalefabricdirect.com – lightweight "china silk" linings (stiff, floaty, many colors),

charmeuse satin (drapey, soft, many colors), chiffon, organza, some stretch fabrics

Tutu.com – spandex, stretch fabrics of many varieties, stiff net and tulle

Wawak.com – apparel industry wholesale shop supplies, such as zippers, pressing equipment, tools of all kinds, threads, needles .... More toys than you ever thought you needed, and vastly cheaper than retail even with their flat rate shipping

### Other fabric resources

Thrift stores – look for sheets, blankets, curtains, tablecloths Bedding stores – clearance sheets, tablecloths, curtains

Craigslist – as above

eBay - fabric by the yard, trims, patterns, almost anything you can think up

Etsy – trims, laces, beads, interfacing, buckles, buttons, reflective tape

## Other resources

Hardware stores: Zip ties, colored tapes, plumbing and refrigerator tubing, aluminum flashing, spray paint

Party stores: Balloons, décor items that can be re-purposed: plastic tablecloths, cake decorations, art supplies

Rhinestones: Michaels and Hobby Lobby have glue-on and iron-on ("hotfix") stones as well as sequins, craft stones, trims, etc.

Therhinestoneguy.com – house brand stones are fine for this kind of costume

Old medical equipment like canes, crutches, ankle/wrist braces, can provide ways of "extending the body"
