

MCKNIGHT FELLOWSHIPS FOR FIBER ARTISTS

Designed to identify and support outstanding mid-career Minnesota artists, the McKnight Fellowships for Fiber Artists provide recipients with a \$25,000 unrestricted cash award. The fellows also receive public recognition, studio visits with critics from the field, an exhibition in the Joan Mondale Gallery at Textile Center, professional development support, participation in public discussions featuring fellows and critics, and access to Textile Center's resources, including a library of 35,000 books and periodicals and a state-of-the-art dye lab. The fellowships are funded by the McKnight Foundation and administered by Textile Center.


Marjorie Fedyszyn



a slightly larger (though still
smaller in scale compared to our
World's Largest Garage Sale)
event in spring 2023 at our
program partner site, MSS — an
organization whose mission is to
support people with disabilities
as vital and contributing
members of our community.

In fall 2023 and winter 2024, with the help of our new Retail and Merchandising Manager, Erin Husted, we held two themed Garage Sales at Textile Center — one focused on fabric and sewing, and one on yarn and needlebased fiber arts. These sales were smaller in scale but allowed for expanded yarn and fabric sections, thanks to focused donation requests and event branding.

In fall 2024, we decided that, for the foreseeable future, Garage Sales would be held onsite at Textile Center. Rooms throughout the entire center were lined with merchandise. Room 3, known as the Fabric by the Bag room, features fabric shelves along every wall.

Friday evening continued to be Preview Sale night, with Saturday entry at \$2–\$5 and free entry on Sunday.

Holding sales onsite allows us to bring people into our space to experience everything that we have to offer — our exhibitions, shop, and more.

In Summer of 2024, we brought back our Summer Camp program from pandemic hiatus, offering three camps for ages 7 - 12 years old. It was exciting to have the energy and laughter of young ones in our building once again!

We also launched our Future Fiber Artists program, which aims to cultivate the next generation of fiber art enthusiasts and help foster excitement, confidence, and competency in youth ages 7-12 years old around needle-based fiber arts such as crocheting, knitting, embroidery, and hand-stitching.

This program was launched thanks to the Denise Ann Richter Youth Fiber Art Fund, established after Textile Center received a generous \$25,000 donation from a brother and sister, Rory and Molly, in honor of their friend, Denise, who shared her passion for fiber art with them throughout their lives.
